SAR Tips - Reminders

Lost Person Behaviour: Children 1 - 3 Years old

- Unaware of the concept of being lost.
- Navigational skills and sense of direction are non-existent.
- They have no idea how to return home or to a point of familiarity
- They are very likely to wander aimlessly
- They are unlikely to respond to searchers
- They are likely to find somewhere to lie down and sleep such as thick bush, under a rock, picnic table or somewhere else they may find or perceive to be shelter.
- They are inquisitive and easily distracted by some thing that has got their attention.

SEARCH STRATEGY

A child this age will not travel a great distance, however, due to the fact that they are unlikely to respond to searchers, a thorough search is of the utmost importance. It is very useful with this category of lost person that "pet names" are known to searchers. If a child is named "Toby" but the parents call him "Tootsie", then he/she is unlikely to respond to a searcher calling "Toby". Know if the child has a favorite pet or stuffed animal and use this in order to get the child to respond.

Tracking

Sign: This is any change in the natural environment that is caused by an animal or person passing through the area. For example a disturbed rock, broken twigs, bent grass, footprint etc.

POA x POD = POS

PLS: Point Last Seen. The location that the missing person was known for certain to have been. Is usually the starting point for a search.

POA Probability Of Area. The likelihood that the search object, or clues, are in that particular area.

POD: Probability Of Detection. The likelihood of locating the subject in a particular area using a certain type of resource in certain conditions.

POS: Probability Of Success. The chances of finding the search object, given the POD and POA.
